It should accomplish the following: ✓ Restate your theme statement (use different wording if poss) ✓ Include a last bit of commentary to ensure closure It should never: ✓ Start a new idea (or argument) Example conclusion: Throughout the novel, Harry Potter enjoys the help of his best friends, Ron and Hermione, Headmaster Dumbledore, and some other Professors, to help him overcome many evils. In the end, with this help, Harry is able to defeat Voldemort, and along with his friends, successfully completes his first year at Hogwarts.
